THE MAIN EVENT: PAUL VERSUS JAMES James 2:14

"What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him?"

- I. Round One: Paul Takes The Offense
 - A. Salvation is <u>God's Work</u>."By Grace you have been saved." (Ephesians 2:8)
 - B. Salvation is God's work in **God's Way**.

 "Through faith; and that not of yourselves."

 (Ephesians 2:8b)
 - C. Salvation is God's work, in God's way, according to **God's Will**.

"We are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

II. Round Two: James Counters

- A. A faith without fruit is a **false faith**. "Can faith save you?" (James 2:17)
- B. A faith without fruit is a <u>futile faith</u>.
 "You say you have faith...show me...even the demons believe and tremble." (James 2:18-19)
- C. A faith without fruit is a **fatal faith**.

 "Faith without works is dead ... DOA." (James 2:26)
- D. "We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto **good works**." (Ephesians 2:10)
- E. "Of His own will He brought us forth (chose us) by the word of truth." (James 1:18)
- F. It is not about faith <u>and</u> works, but a faith **that** works.
