Fall Rush: Saturday, October 4, 2014 6-8:30pm CenterStage

Fall Rush is an outreach event created to give First Dallas Students and your family the opportunity to carry out the Great Commission! Drive Weekend: Friday, January 16 - Sunday, January 18, 2015 Student Center

Drive Weekend offers students the encouragement, accountability, and fellowship they need to continue passionately pursuing Christ. Several worship services throughout the weekend with messages pointing directly to the spiritual needs of teenagers will certainly inspire your teenager. Students stay in homes for the weekend with a leader who invests in their lives at every turn.

Worship & Mission Tours: March 7-13, 2015

There is no better way to encourage your student to live for Jesus than to send them out to serve those who desperately need the love of Christ. Students will serve others, as well as lead them in worship. (The Worship and Mission Tour is open to all students.)

Beach Camp: June 12-17, 2015 Gulf Shores, AL

Beach Camp will be in Orange Beach, Alabama at a Student Life Camp in 2014. It will be the highlight of your teenager's year and they will experience Christ like never before!!! Our camp pastor will be David Nasser of Nasser Outreach. David is involved in revivals, citywide rallies, camps, and school assemblies, and speaks to over 700,000 people each year. Sunday Mornings:

Sunday School 9:15am: Sunday morning in First Dallas Students consist of worship and master teaching followed by small groups. Our small groups are separated by grade and gender and are led by the First Dallas Students adult leadership team.

COLLISION 9:15am: One Sunday every month First Dallas Students hosts a Collision. Collision is a monthly, evangelistic opportunity for the growing teenage disciple of Christ to be His hands and feet to the teenage community in the DFW area. Students invite their friends, neighbors, classmates, and teammates to a time of worship and teaching where the gospel is presented.

Sunday Evenings:

Student Choir Rehearsal 5:30-7pm: Nicholas Costello will lead rehearsals in preparation for tour, concert dates, and other performance opportunities.

Student Orchestra Rehearsal 5:30-7pm: Jeremy Godwin will lead rehearsals in preparation for performance opportunities.

Mid-Week Opportunities:

The Avenue: The Avenue is a discipleship-oriented experience for teenagers every Wednesday night from 6:30-8pm in First Dallas Students (excluding VBS and holidays). Open gym starts at 5pm in the Wicker Gym followed by free food and hangout before we have an exciting night of games, skits, worship, and a relevant message from God's Word.

Summer Program in First Dallas Students:

In the summer, First Dallas Students continues *The Avenue*, but with a slight twist! Instead of our typical nights at the church we host several events such as Six Flags, SpeedZone, Nights of Worship, a student-led service, Girls Pinterest parties, Guys Paintball trip, Dodgeball Tournaments, and so much more!









The Eight Checkpoints of First Dallas Students

The eight checkpoints exist as a guide to direct the sermon series each year in First Dallas Students. We believe our checkpoints are the major subjects we as a student ministry should be teaching your student. Therefore, each year your student will be exposed to biblical teaching as it pertains to one of the following eight checkpoints:

- 1. Evangelism: First Dallas Students exists to encourage teenagers to know God and make Him known. This checkpoint includes sermon series like *Lost & Found* or *The Rush* to help teenagers carry out the Great Commission in their spheres of influence. We believe it is important to strategically place each series within the specific season of our student ministry. Therefore, evangelism series are typically the month before an event like *Fall Rush* where First Dallas Students are challenged to bring their un-churched friends to be introduced to Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:19-20).
- **2. Relationships:** Relationships impact every aspect of a teenager's life. We are not just talking about dating relationships, but relationships with friends, siblings, and even parents. It has been said that one the greatest skills one can have is the ability to build healthy relationships with others. This checkpoint exists to help teenagers build and recognize healthy relationships according to scripture (Philippians 2:2-4).
- **3. Spiritual Life:** Spiritual Life ranges from series like *Life Apps*, a series on the fruit of the Spirit, and *Meant to Live*, a series challenging students to find God's plan and purpose for their lives. It is meant to help teenagers discover in God's Word how to develop spiritual disciplines to live a godly life on a daily basis (Matthew 5:48).
- **4. Worldviews:** In a world that has numerous religions and conflicting theories about "how it all began," this checkpoint is meant to tackle many mainstream beliefs with a biblical perspective to help teenagers "own" their faith. For example, a series entitled *Lenses: Religions of the World*, equipped teenagers with the knowledge and tools needed to share their faith with those of the Mormon, Jehovah's Witness, Islam, and Judaist belief systems.
- **5. Bible:** Each year First Dallas Students takes a character of the bible in a series called *On the Record* and goes through a book of the bible, such as *Hebrews*, to provide practical insight for teenagers. We believe that specific figures and books in the bible apply directly to what teenagers encounter on a regular basis. *On the Record with David* encouraged students that even though we make mistakes, God forgives and does not waste those experiences.
- **6. Topical:** Topical exists to provide biblical answers for teenagers struggling with temptation in *The Fight*, understanding theological confusion in Hollywood in *At The Movies*, and simply to provide solutions to tough questions asked by our students in *Frustrated?*. These series provide a fun and practical way to communicate biblical truth to teenagers.
- 7. **Jesus:** Series such as *The Good Life* (Sermon on the Mount) and *Behind the Scene* (Christmas) provide insight into the teaching and earthly life of Jesus Christ. As the greatest man and teacher that ever lived, Jesus Christ is the standard by which we should live our lives (Romans 8:29).
- **8. Church:** This checkpoint ensures that First Dallas Students understand for what purpose the church exists and what the lives of those in the church should look like. Series such as *Members Only: When Church Goes Bad* and *Why Church?* serve as attention grabbers as teenagers learn the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19, 20), the Greatest Commandment (Matthew 22:37-39), and the importance of being a part of the church (Hebrews 10:25).









First Dallas Students Teaching Plan 2014-15

AUGUST

SERIES: In-Focus 8/24 & 8/31 (Topical): First Dallas Students exists to help teenagers "know God and make God known." This series is intended to get our focus back on the Great Commission. We are going to focus our energy on 1) Knowing God and his plan for our lives and, 2) Making God known to others.

SEPTEMBER

SERIES: The Kingdom (Evangelism): What is the kingdom of God? Where is it and who belongs in it? *The Kingdom* will answer those questions as well as equip students with the tools needed to share the gospel as we approach First Dallas Students' biggest evangelistic event of the year: Fall Rush.

OCTOBER

SERIES: Generosity (Spiritual Life): What does it look like to live a life of generosity? Does it mean that I have to give a lot of money or my possessions? Does it mean that I have give of my time and energy for a good cause? In *Generosity* we are going to talk about how we ought to live a life of generosity because we serve a generous God. **NOVEMBER**

SERIES: Legendary (Jesus): Jesus Christ walked on water, restored sight, healed lifelong paralysis, and raised someone from the dead to name a few of the miracles He performed. *Legendary* takes a look at the miracles of Jesus found in Scripture and how His teachings and the faith of those being healed apply to students today. **DECEMBER**

SERIES: Lights (Bible): We all love seeing the extravagant lighting designs neighbors and businesses have during the Christmas season. Who doesn't? *Lights* will explore how the hype of decorations and gifts during this busy season of the year can take our eyes off the one true light, Jesus Christ. Students will be challenged to practically be the salt and light in a dark world (Matt. 5:13-16).

JANUARY & FEBRUARY

SERIES: Real Stuff (Topical): Teenagers are starving for the truth concerning topics such as homosexuality, dating, abortion, sex, depression, drugs and alcohol, tattoos and piercings, and marriage and divorce. *Real Talk* is designed to take students on a journey to understanding God's Word concerning each of these *real* issues they are facing.

MARCH

SERIES: Family Matters (Relationships): Relationships can be difficult. Relationships within the family are no exception. Family Matters is intended to take a practical look at the character of our heavenly Father, honoring our father and mother, sibling rivalry, and reconciling family relationships. We pray this series is a blessing to your family as we study the importance God's Word places on the family unit.

APRIL & MAY

SERIES: Doctrine (Bible & Church): We can all agree that being grounded in the Scriptures is of high importance in every Christian's life. In this teenage-friendly series we will dive into major doctrines of the bible. We will study biblical doctrines such as Soteriology, Christology, Pneumatology, Ecclesiology, and Revelation. **IUNE**

SERIES: Lenses: Cults of the World (Worldviews): There are many belief systems in the world that are more than simply "religions" or "sets of beliefs;" they are cults. In this series of *Lenses* students will see the errors of these false religions. Our intention is that they will be better equipped to engage the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ as a result of this series.

IULY & AUGUST

SERIES: I Am (Jesus): The book of John includes many "I am" statements Jesus made during His earthly ministry. So what does He mean when He says He is the Bread of Life, the Light, Before Abraham I am, the Good Shepherd, the Resurrection and the Life, the way the truth and the life, or the True Vine? In *I Am* we will explain these "I Am" statements and how they apply to student' everyday life.











"Leading in Truth"

LEAD365 is a ministry of First Dallas Students that is purposed in growing, equipping and involving students to become leaders inside and outside of the student ministry.

What does LEAD365 involve?

Curriculum

LEAD365 students will be given a leadership curriculum to complete during the school year. The curriculum contains weekly lessons centered around different leadership ideas each month. This is not a devotional for students but rather a learning tool to help them grow. The curriculum guides students through different Bible passages each week and applies the truth of the passages to leadership.

Ministry Groups

There are four different ministry teams in LEAD365

- 1. **Prayer** the prayer team is tasked with meeting on Sunday mornings to pray for the weekly services, events, students, student leadership and one another.
- 2. **Publicity** the publicity team offers creative ideas for student ministry events, helps promote ministry activities, and serves as a backchannel for student input.
- 3. **First Impressions** the first impressions team has the responsibility of greeting and guest services.
- 4. **Worship** the student worship team is under the leadership of the student worship interns but is also part of LEAD365.

Requirements

- Uphold the values, vision, mission and goals of First Dallas Students
- Arrive and check in with your ministry team leader by 8:45 on Sundays
- Serve with your ministry team 3 of every 4 Sundays a month
- Attend 75% of the monthly meetings
- Attend 75% of all First Dallas Student activities (i.e. Fall Rush, Drive Weekend, Beach Camp, etc.)
